Letter from the Rector

Thy Kingdom Come

Dear friends...

Have you heard of TKC? Thy Kingdom Come (TKC) is a global ecumenical prayer movement that began in May 2016. Since then it using art in prayer, and there are links to has grown into a movement which unites videos showing how to pray in each style. more than a million Christians in prayer, in nearly 90% of countries worldwide, across This year's *Novena* is written by Bishop 85 different denominations and traditions.

It invited Christians around the world to prav from Ascension to Pentecost for more people to come to know Jesus - so that friends and family, neighbours and colleagues might come to Christian faith.

When Jesus spoke to His disciples before mation about all the resources, including for ascending to heaven He promised them " vou will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses ... to the ends of the earth.* (Acts 1.8).

Those first followers responded to this promise by constantly devoting themselves to prayer, day after day, until the Holy Spirit focussing on things about which we disagree. came upon them in power.

These days between Ascension and Pentecost faithful prayer. can, for us too, be infused with expectation and anticipation. We too can pray, individually and together, for a fresh outpouring of the Holy Spirit. We can pray for more people to come to know God's life-transforming love.

This year, during the period from Ascension Day to Pentecost (9th to 19th May), every person, household and church are being encouraged to pray during these eleven days in their own way. Specifically, we are asked to choose five people who do not yet know the love of God-in-Christ for themselves, and to pray that God's Spirit might work in their lives - that they would respond with their *Yes* to God's call.

To support us in doing this, the national church has produced a series of new and updated resources - both online and in print. This year's Prayer Journal explores different ways of praying - such as prayer walking and

Leicestershire's churches contain a wealth of ignored mediaeval sculpture depicting a wide variety of subjects, including grotesque beasties, so called 'Green Men' and even rather rude exhibitionists. We may not know the names of the skilled carvers but this fully illustrated talk tries to deduce what was going on in this minds.



Bob Trubshaw is the author of numerous books, articles and YouTube videos about local history, folklore and archaeology and this will be a fascinating evening.

Thursday, 5th September: A talk by Matthew Morris of ULAS on the excavations recently undertaken at Leicester Cathedral. Over the past three years, archaeologists from University of

Leicester Archaeological Services (ULAS) have been working with Leicester Cathedral to reveal the story of the 9009 year old church and the Roman city buries beneath it. The excavations, carried out before construction of a new Heritage Learning Centre in the



Cathedral Gardens, have resulted in a remarkable archaeological archive of regional and national significance. Discoveries include a highly unusual, continuous 850 year sequence of burial activity, as well as Anglo-Saxon, Roman and prehistoric activity dating back over 15,000 years. The results have the potential to tell powerful and engaging stories about Leicester's past, which will capture your imagination.

EASTWELL HISTORY GROUP, cont.

Thursday, 10th October: A talk by John S Thomas of ULAS on the Iron Age hill fort at Burrough Hill. Burrough Hill is an Iron Age hillfort seven miles south of Melton Mowbray. The site commands views over the surrounding countryside for miles around. There has been human activity in the area since at least the Mesolithic, and the hillfort was founded in the early Iron Age (1200 BC to 500 BC). Various excavations have recorded parts of the ramparts, a 'guard chamber', Iron Age/early Roman pits in the fort's interior and roundhouses in the northern part of the fort. John will explain in detail the work that has been undertaken in recent years to learn more about this important site.

The restored Eastwell Iron Ore Co. locomotive 'Lord Granby' will be on display on 2nd June. Eastwell History Group has negotiated with Amberley Museum in West Sussex for the long term loan of the last known remaining truck (tram) from the ironstone days. When the guarrying of ironstone was discontinued, much of the asset, vis 'Lord Granby', was distributed around various preservation bodies. After some expert sleuthing, the tram was tracked

down and it should be back home at the beginning of May.

It will be available for purchase at the Open Day alongside the original book for those who don't currently have one.
