35 hours/month (negotiable) - salary £18.50/hour

We are an easy going, open minded but determined group of elected Parish Councillors representing the three villages of Eaton, Eastwell and Goadby Marwood who would like to appoint a new Parish Clerk to help us maintain and, where required, improve the environment in which we are proud to live.

This role may suit someone with experience of being a Parish Clerk or alternatively someone who may be searching for their next career who has sound administration, communication, financial management and organisational skills obtained in a previous career. It would also be beneficial to have a keen interest in rural affairs.

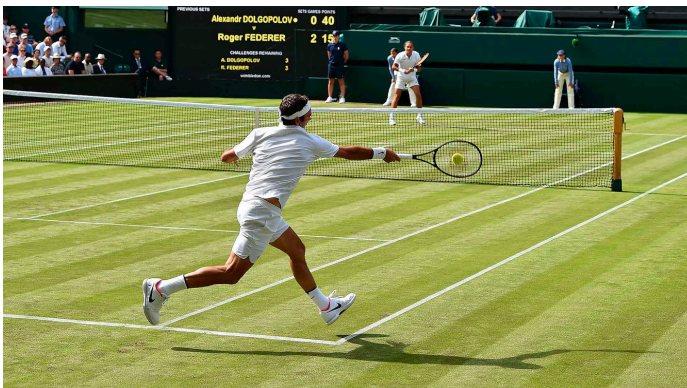

LETTER FROM THE RECTOR

Heaven in ordinary

Dear friends,

The month of June sees the Church emerging from the long season of Lent and Easter into the even longer Trinity season, which stretches through the summer into the autumn. Some churches call this period 'Ordinary Time', and that is the heading on the green covered booklets we use for Common Worship Holy Communion services across the Ironstone Churches during this period.


In our anxious and uncertain war-torn world, most of us are probably yearning for a touch of the ordinary right now. After all, ordinary is the norm for much of our everyday lives, isn't it? Life is not one endless festival, but rather a rhythm of ordinary daily routines which are punctuated by special times - celebrations which mark a significant moment, or maybe the experience of a special holiday. And without ordinary, we would not really appreciate the special and the extraordinary.

The Church's year reflects this, as Ordinary is normal for much of the time. George Herbert, the seventeenth-century priest-poet, wrote a poem called Prayer, in which he used the delightful phrase 'heaven in ordinary'. As we enter these weeks of Ordinary Time, may we encounter God's presence in the ordinary, or as Herbert puts it in his poem 'Heaven in ordinary ... something understood'

Prayer the church's banquet, angel's age,
God's breath in man returning to his birth,
The soul in paraphrase, heart in pilgrimage,
The Christian plummet sounding heav'n and earth
Engine against th' Almighty, sinner's tow'r,
Reversed thunder, Christ-side-piercing spear,
The six-days world transposing in an hour,
~A kind of tune, which all things hear and fear;
Softness, and peace, ,and joy, and love, and bliss,
Exalted manna, gladness of the best,
Heaven in ordinary, man well drest,
The milky way, the bird of Paradise,
Church-bells beyond the stars heard, the soul's blood,
The land of spices; something understood.

just10 The world has changed. But some truths remain timeless.

At the final session of the Bible Course, many of the participants expressed a desire for further opportunities to meet together for Bible study and discussion, prayer and fellowship. Additionally, several church members have asked for a summer evening course, when there's no necessity to come or go in the dark. So through July with a final session later in August, I'll be running **just10** in St Mary's Church, Melton Mowbray. Sessions will begin promptly at 7.30 pm and finish by 9.00 pm at the latest.

Hundreds of churches have used the **just10** course to consider God's timeless truths and how to apply them to our lives today. Produced by the Revd Canon J John (author and broadcaster), the material includes video input and conversation-starters. Beginning with the Old Testament Ten Commandments, J John leads us to consider how as Christians, living in the light of Christ's cross and resurrection, we can unpack the principles of biblical teaching in our own time and place.

In order for this to be a 'summer course' we shall focus on two of the Commandments in each of our five sessions. just10 looks at the Ten Commandments in reverse order - starting at the tenth commandment and gradually working through to finish with a challenging final focus on the first commandment, with its emphasis on putting God first in every area of our lives.

All are welcome to join us for as many of the following Monday evening sessions as you can manage.

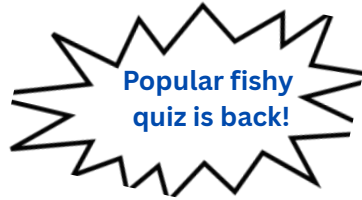

HELP OUR LOCAL HEDGEHOGS 🦔

"If it's out in the day, it's not okay!"

I recently found a sick hedgehog in my garden. Thanks to **Digby's Hedgehog Rescue**, it was treated for lungworm and safely released back home. I had no idea help like this existed locally - and now I want others to know too!

🚚 How to spot a hedgehog emergency?

Call a rescue if you see one that is:

- Out in daylight (esp. weak or wobbly)
- Coughing or bubbling at the nose
- Injured, limping or caught in netting
- Covered in flies or maggots
- Very small or out in cold weather

⚠️ What to do with a poorly hedgehog?

- Place in a high-sided box with a towel
- Keep warm, quiet, and away from pets
- Offer water (never milk!)
- Call a rescue immediately

♥️ Be a Hedgehog Hero!

- Avoid pesticides (esp. slug pellets)
- Check grass before mowing / burn piles before lighting
- Put out a shallow dish of water
- Supervise pets at night
- Create a hedgehog highway in the fences (5" x 5" gap for access)
- Leave logs or leaf piles for shelter
